3. Parenting Young Children Project

- Anne Marie Mauricio, Ph.D., Associate Research Professor, Prevention Science Institute, University of Oregon
- Parenting young Children is an online version of the Family Check-up for children up to 5 years old
- The Family Check-Up curriculum is similar to Triple-P and is tailored with a strengthsbased focus
- The curriculum is culturally responsive and looks at that the parent is the expert with an equal power balance between the coach and the parents
- Coaching sessions are available to families to help support the modules and create strengths and plans for parents going forward
- Families complete 4 interviews throughout the year to gauge change
- Parents receive up to \$475 over the course of the year for their completion of the process
- There is also a version for older children from 6-18 years old, for more information on this one please reach out to Anne Marie

4. RSA & ECSA Update

- The ELD directed assessments addressing access to early care and education in our region to all early learning hubs across the state
- The main focus of these assessments for the first round is to address and identify the barriers to high quality affordable care in Lane County
- Within the Regional Systems Assessment, a smaller project was assigned, the ECSA which used to be called the Early Childhood Sector Plan
- The ESCA piece is trying to figure out within of our priority populations, who are being served and out of who is being served is there needs being met

- There will be a family survey that will be sent out next week and go through the end of November
- There will also be a series of focus groups to hear from families within our priority populations about not only what is existing but also what they see as the barriers in the systems for them
- QCC will provide data from providers and what their views about barriers and issues within the systems
- Additionally smaller focus groups with large employers will be held to see what they believe barriers are and what they do to support their employees
- All of those surveys and focus groups will them inform the report to develop a plan and be sent to the state so that they can see and try to get some policy changed

- Migrant Ed
 - Just got done with mass enrollment and over half are already enrolled in preschool
- St Vincent de Paul/First Place Kids
 - Main location is now at 4060 W Amazon Dr
 - Changed service requirements to coincide with the definition of Homeless populations so families need to be actively unhoused in order to receive services
 - Trying to expand the old location into a preschool promise location
 - Trying to hire a teacher at that location please contact for places to post
 - While there are some programs for people who are currently not unhoused

- Homes for Good is trying to have preschools in their new developments
- ODHS
 - ERDC program is migrating to the department of Learning and Care in July 2023
 - Some changes that may take place before the transition:

- Expand access to the program to High School and College students and people on medical leave (more info surrounding the expansion will be available by January)
- Public Health emergency hasn't ended yet
 - Emergency allotment funding still approved through Nov
 - Pandemic EBT funds that were approved for school year of 21-22
 - Funds went out yesterday!
- Parenting Now
 - New Executive Director Theya Johnson
 - Hiring Bilingual-Bicultural Parent Educator
 - Lots of in-person events
 - Baby connection in-person and online
 - Make Parenting a Pleasure
- South Lane School District
 - Have morning and afternoon session play groups on Tuesdays and Thursdays
 - Have Make Parenting a Pleasure classes and Doula Support programs on Fridays in Spanish
- Looking Glass
 - Few therapists who are engaging in an 18 month long training on Child-Parent Psychotherapy for children 0-5
 - Recently hired 2 bilingual therapists
 - Continue to take on referrals to create a bigger access to families
