 - If a family has submitted after the first lottery but before the second lottery they can change location preferences on their own, but if they have been run in the first lottery they will need to contact preschoolpromise@unitedwaylane.org
 - There are around 570 slots with new locations in Mapleton, McKenzie and Pleasant Hill, also 72 slots available at a new Springfield location

3. Black Early Learning & Lane AABSS (African American/Black Student Success)

- The Black Early Learning and Lane AABSS program through United Way serves children from Birth – Age 5
- Eligibility to receive assistance from the program is not income based and is offered to any Black Diaspora child 0-6 in Lane County
- Within the program Ayanna assists families based on their needs including Family Visits, referrals to community resources, park playgroups, preschool to kindergarten transition, and other activities based on a family's needs

4. Lane County Family Child Health Programs

- Who to refer:
 - All pregnant individual
 - Newborns under 3 months
 - Children and youth up to 21 years of age with complex diagnoses whose family could use more support navigating resources
- Refer patients as soon as possible, there are various programs that are tied to gestational time
- There are a lot of Guatemalan Mam speaking groups from South Lane that are involved in this program
- All of their staff are home visit based, and if clients are not comfortable with that there
 are a bunch of other locations available to meet
 - If the client wants to meet at a family members house they can do that as well

5. Migrant Education Program

- The Migrant Ed program is a federal program for preschool to high school graduation 3-22 under the ODE
- During the school year a minimum of 3 home visits with educational kits is provided to families within the program
- They have a summer school from preschool to middle school with teachers from Mexico, around 70 preschoolers attended this summer school this year

6. Agency Updates

- Lane County Public Health
 - Health Family Coordinator position is coming back into Lane County
 - Picking Catch Back up
- Quality Care Connections
 - Working with United Way to kick off Preschool Promise (PSP) and were funded to hire 2 more PSP coaches in classrooms supporting teachers with social emotional skills for students (Now 3 coaches total)
 - Working with the new start up and expansion grant, currently looking through interest applications and will review them before sending them off to research institute at Western Oregon
 - If you know of an agency that wants to startup or expand their childcare practice they can apply, you just need to be licensed
 - Starting a market price survey to collect data on cost/tuition of childcare for the state
 - New training bulletin just went out for fall classes
 - Just had a survey gone out to see what childcare providers need
- Eugene Public Library
 - Story times at downtown locations and both other branch locations throughout the week
 - Trying out a new story time blocks (set time periods ie fall, spring) instead of having them every week throughout the year
 - Does not have sensory story time currently; however they are hoping to bring it back in the new year (ie. January).

 - Early Childhood team starting an 18 month training program (Childcare and Psychotherapy)
 - 4 folks on Early childhood team taking clients 0-5

 and a varying level of bilingual story time on Sat
 - Will begin an emerging reader group in October
 - Also has book clubs for kids and tweens

 - Offering conscious discipline training for prek-2nd grade teachers as well as childcare providers
 - If you are interested you can join them in a training or through grant money, no strings attached, you can be provided access to an ecourse to learn 7 skills of conscious discipline
